The May 29, 2008, BAARC Board Meeting was called to order by President Lyle, KØLFV at 4PM at the Brainerd Public Library. In attendance were Vice-President, Steve, KCØYTE, Treasurer, John W3MQD, Director, John, KØWY, Emergency Communications, Al, WØRC and members, Terry, KIØFW, Roger, WØWUG, and Shirley, KØDCW.

The April Board Meeting Minutes, as published in the BAARCer, were accepted as written. Our Treasurer, John, W3MQD, gave the financial report. Both items were accepted unanimously following a motion by Terry, KIØFW and a second by Al, WØRC.

Upcoming BAARC events include: The Tour of the Lakes Bike Ride – June 7th, 2008. More operators are needed for this event. BAARC is working with Emergency Management on Tuesday, June 24th, 2008 on an exercise that includes the entire Central Region of Minnesota. If you can operate, contact Al, WØRC or John, WØWY. ARRL Field Day is June 28 & 29, and will be held at Cuyuna Overlook. Our Brainerd Hamfest is July 12, 2008.

Al, WØRC, gave an update on emergency communications and future plans.

The BAARC Board voted to update the mission statement for our club to include “The Amateur’s Code.” The modification to the mission statement was unanimously approved.

Our next membership meeting will be on June 26th and will be held at the Brainerd Fire Station. The June board meeting will be at the Brainerd Public Library in the small meeting room. The July 26th meeting will be our Fox Hunt and Picnic.

Our Treasurer, John, W3MQD, will prepare the 2008 – 2009 BAARC budget report.

The meeting was adjourned following a motion by Steve, KCØYTE and a second by John, W3MQD.

Ham Radio Operators Demonstrate Modern Capabilities

Public Demo of Emergency Communications June 28-29

Newington, CT – Thousands of Ham Radio operators will be showing off their emergency capabilities this weekend. Over the past year, the news has been full of reports of ham radio operators providing critical communications in emergencies world-wide. During Hurricane Katrina, Amateur Radio – often called "Ham radio" - was often the ONLY way people could communicate, and hundreds of volunteer "hams" traveled south to save lives and property. When trouble is brewing, ham radio people are often the first to provide critical information and communications. On the weekend of June 28-29, the public will have a chance to meet and talk with these ham radio operators and see for themselves what the Amateur Radio Service is about. Showing the newest digital and satellite capabilities, voice communications and even historical Morse code, hams from across the USA will be holding public demonstrations of emergency communications abilities.

This annual event, called "Field Day" is the climax of the week long "Amateur Radio Week" sponsored by the ARRL, the National Association for Amateur Radio. Using only emergency power supplies, ham operators will construct emergency stations in parks, shopping malls, schools and back yards around the country. Their slogan, "**When all else fails...**" is more than just words to the hams as they prove they can send messages in many forms without the use of phone systems, internet or any other infrastructure that can be compromised in a crisis. More than 34,000 amateur radio operators across the country participated in last year's event.

"We hope that people will come and see for themselves, this is not your grandfather's radio anymore," said Allen Pitts of the ARRL. "The communications networks that ham radio people can quickly create have saved many lives in the past months when other systems failed or were overloaded."

In the Brainerd (Crow Wing County) area, the Brainerd Area Amateur Radio Club will again be demonstrating Amateur Radio at the Cuyuna City Overlook (same as last year) on the 28th and 29th.. The Club invites the public to come and see ham radio's capabilities and learn how to get their own FCC radio license before the next disaster strikes.

There are 650,000 Amateur Radio operators in the US, and more than 2.5 million around the world. Through the ARRL, ham volunteers provide emergency communications for the DHS Citizens' Corps, Salvation Army, FEMA and hundreds of state and local agencies, all for free.

The 19th Annual Tour of the Lakes Bicycle Ride will be on Saturday, June 7th. It begins and ends in Crosslake, MN. The BAARC has provided communications for this event many times in the past and it is always fun to be there. Plan on participating as a radio operator this year.

An emergency exercise will be held on June 24th. It involves providing communications for a distribution of needed supplies in time of emergency. Ham Radio is to be the communications medium. Contact Al WØRC or John WØWY to participate in this practice.

The Annual ARRL Field Day will be Saturday and Sunday, June 28th and 29th this year. The BAARC plans to participate by setting up at the Cuyuna Country State Recreation Area near Crosby-Ironton, MN. This is the same location as last year where club members and friends had a great time making 310 contacts in wonderful summer weather. Here is your chance to invite non-hams to learn about the hobby. See you there.



This year's **Brainerd Area Hamfest will be Saturday, July 12th**, at the Brainerd National Guard Armory in Brainerd. The hours will be 9 AM to 1 PM. New this year will be VE testing at 10 AM followed by a seminar on VSWR by Mark WØMH. We will need your help to set up tables starting at noon on Friday, July 11th.
