The President opened the meeting at 4:05 PM with 8 board members and 2 members in attendance. There were no May minutes due to the Spring Dinner replacing the May Board and Membership meeting. The Treasurer's report was presented and approved. The Treasurer announced the Spring Dinner was a financial success with receipts more than covering expenses. Club equipment and liability insurance were also discussed.

Upcoming Events: Al WØRC and Shirley KØDCW reported on preparations for the **Brainerd Hamfest** on Saturday July 9th. The chili has been made, arrangements for the PA system completed, and the first ticket and table reservations received. Final facility arrangements are being completed at the **National Guard Armory**. Shirley reminded everyone to bring cookies and bars to sell along with the chili. Dave KCØTGT will chair the **Lakes Country Triathlon** on Sunday, August 1st with only 4-5 operators needed for the 2-3 hour event.

Digital & Emergency Communications: Al reported on the recent antenna adjustments made to the Club's Gull Lake repeater site. The 4 dipoles that were grouped to the south side were separated and reoriented to all 4 sides to allow for a better omni-directional radiation pattern. Lyle was thanked for his hard work in making Field Day a success.

Old Business: Ron KØGOP and Steve NØCRM reported on the recent updates to the Club website. The old group photo space has been replaced with a banner graphic that will change to reflect the current event or topic of interest. Clicking this area will link to another page with more information. Lyle KØLFV is almost finished with the Club equipment inventory and only needs a couple additional components to complete the Club's Remote Station project. Training will be held for interested Club members at that time. If anyone has a Dow-Key relay to offer for a remote antenna switch, please contact Lyle. Steve reported the transfer of the Club bulletin board from Jim WØIRE has been completed.

New Business: All and John WØWY discussed the possibility of again teaching a fall/winter Ham Class. Thursday evenings were proposed with a start date of September or October, depending upon sufficient local community interest. The Board Meeting was adjourned at 4:55 PM.

DX and the Paper Chase

Have you ever heard an operator say "if I can hear them I can work them." Well, you don't want to take that one to the bank. During these less-than-good band conditions I've listened to DX operators booming in with good modulation and not breaking a sweat on the "S" meter. Under some band conditions good modulation and no power reading your signal-strength meter clouds your chances of getting a signal back to the DX station, especially if there's a pileup—the operator cannot hear your signal. Speaking of band conditions, what's going on with Cycle 24? Over the past several weeks the magic band has been king with lots of good DX available on 6-meters. What I'm leading up to is simply this: working DX has been difficult at times, meaning you have to work harder. Remember the old proverb "when the going gets tough, the tough get going." This is a pretty good analogy of what it took to work DX over the past month. I find myself doing more looking than transmitting, but I still get on the bands calling CQ. Several times this past month there have been superb openings after sundown into Europe on 17 meters. Also, I worked into New Zealand (again), which always gives me that adrenalin rush when a ZL answers my call. For most of this past month we had visitors from California. But I'm looking forward to more operating time over the next two months. Of course, I'm always looking for more DX. Remember, sit down at your station and call CQ because someone somewhere is out there waiting for your call. So long from Huntersville for now, 73 and good DX from Bob/WØZPE.

Steve NØCRM's and John WØWY's FD Experience: (See pix on page 4)

Steve (NØCRM) partnered up with John (WØWY) this year and operated out of John's portable trailer. John tried his Comet CH250B vertical antenna while Steve set up two antennas: the first was a Buddipole and the second was a Windom antenna mounted on a painter's pole and tripod combination. Steve operated two radios an FT-857 configured for PSK-31 (connected to the Buddipole) and the second an FT-897 (connected to the Windom). Both radios were connected to a laptop with an additional display, running HRD for PSK and also the N3FJP logging software. Several operators also used the logging software. In spite have having mechanical problems using the painter's pole (extended out too far), the 20, 15, 10, and 6 Meters were booming in on the Windom. On the other side of the bench John worked his vertical with a Yeasu radio as well. It was fun to compare the signals received by the two stations.

To cap off an fun day and to suppress an ever increasing appetite, Steve cooked up a Rueben casserole in a large cast iron Dutch Oven using charcoal and in a smaller Dutch oven cooked up a (from scratch) chocolate cake with a light powdered-sugar topping. Chris KDØLFA and his guest brought a pasta salad with shrimp and deviled eggs. We had dinner on the picnic table next to the club trailer and enjoyed conversation, fresh air, and a great meal combination. After dinner everyone went back to operating again. About 9:00 we received a call from Lyle in the club trailer, and he told us he just made contact with W1AW. BAARC's 2011 Field Day Experience—Lyle KØLFV, FD Coordinator/Chairperson



Propagation was much better than last year, and we are in the process of adding up our total contacts and overall Field Day score that will be submitted to the ARRL. Overall totals will be reported next month. We finally had a couple of days of very nice weather which help make our Field Day experience even better. A total of 21 Hams stopped by to visit and /or to operate one of the stations. Also we had approximately 15 non-hams visiting to see what was going on.








The WX cooperated throughout the FD event—a positive change this year when compared to past years' threatening conditions.
