Thursday, October 27, 2011 – 4:00 PM - BAARC Board Meeting Minutes Brainerd Fire Station

President: Charles Lane, W5CCL Treasurer: Doug Bergsnev, KDØERE Secretary: Ron Finger KØGOP Special Events Co-Director: Dave Fournier, KCØTGT

The President opened the meeting at 4:00 PM with 7 board members and 3 members in attendance. Nate Phillipps of the Pine Tree Council of the Boy Scouts of America was present to talk to the Board about the possibility of working with scouts on the Radio Merit Badge and Jamboree On The Air (JOTA). He will furnish a list of Troop Leader contacts for the purpose of making a presentation to the scouts. Charles W5CCL first contacted Nate and introduced our Club in March of 2010. The September minutes were approved as printed in the October <u>BAARCer</u>. The Treasurer's report was presented by Doug KDØERE and approved. Doug reported on the recent switch of Club insurance policies. For similar coverage, the new policy will save the Club \$631 annually. The treasurer was thanked with a round of applause from the board for his efforts.

Upcoming Events: John WØWY, Steve WØTNT and Ron KØGOP will co-chair the **Goblin Watch** on Monday, October 31st. The **2012 Jaycee Ice Fishing Extravaganza** event will be held on January 21, and the **Mid-MN 150 Dog Sled Race** will be moved up to follow on February 11. The sled course will be changed to shuttle from Remer to Outing and back to Remer. The **Jaycee's Spring Marathon** is scheduled for April 27-28. Al WØRC led a discussion that had started at the September meeting regarding moving our **Brainerd Hamfest** date from July to April 21, and continuing with a late April date in the future. The Board voted to make this change with approval from the Membership. Lyle KØLFV will solicit kitchen-duty help. The Secretary will compile a hamfest mailing database from past raffle ticket receipts with help from Lyle and John.

Digital & Emergency Communications: Al reported on the new Gull Lake repeater site. It is currently operating with good coverage reports, east to Aitkin and west beyond Perham. On a recent trip to Grand Forks, Ron reported good coverage, even past New York Mills, before finally losing contact just south of Frazee, a distance of 70 miles. Adjustments to the audio levels seem to be the only remaining issue. The Board thanked Al and Roger for their continuing repeater efforts.

Old/New Business: Lyle brought up the possibility of discontinuing the telephone line that has served as the autopatch connection for the 147.225 MHz repeater. With little if any use over the last few years, removing this function would save the Club \$468 per year. Following a discussion, the Board elected to remove this feature. Lyle also presented the 2012 Officer Ballot that will be presented at the meeting to members for additional candidates. A motion was made and seconded to again keep the present Club dues structure for the coming 2012 membership year and passed.

The Board Meeting was adjourned at 5:00 PM.

DX and the Paper Chase

Last month at this time as I was typing my column, you'll remember that I was pretty much bummed out because I was unable to work East Timor (4W6); but I also mentioned that I'd be haunting the bands looking and waiting. My time came a few days later as I worked the DXpedition and later in the week my call was in the online log. Yippee! Not to be undone with my success, I worked Benin (TY), South Sudan (STØ), Rotuma (3D2) and...Reunion Island (FR). If you're counting, that's five new DXCC credits going to my DXCC 300 endorsement. DX is good and the bands are hopping, all of them. What a pleasure it is to sit down at my station and listen to the hustle and bustle around the globe and all of them with good signals. Cycle 24 got off to a poor start, but lately the DX is as good as it gets. I lost the power supply to my solid state linear with a failure in the switching mode to the amplifier (a 12.5 volt relay circuit) that is being corrected at the factory. During this time I've been operating barefoot and guess what folks...when propagation is as good as it's been, you simply do not need a KW of power. I worked East Kiribati (T32) barefoot and broke up a pretty good pileup. This DXpedition has already logged over 140K Q's and they're still going strong. This is a good opportunity to work a new one for those of you going for DXCC credits and—its easy. Sometimes I have a tendency to forget that every HF contact is like gaining a new friend. I have made literally thousands of friends without leaving the comfort of my shack. This evening I worked a very special friend in Japan (JE1) whom I've worked dozens of times over the years with an enduring friendship. We never run out of things to talk about. What a great hobby this is. Remember to sit down at your radio and call CQ, someone somewhere out there wants to be your friend. Don't disappoint anyone. So long from Huntersville for now. 73 and good DX from Bob WØZPE.

Ed Antolik, KAØEXB, Silent Key. We were deeply saddened to hear of Ed's death. As you may remember from the October <u>BAARCer</u>, he had been hospitalized. Sadly, he died on 10-07-11 of those medical complications. **Lyle KØLFV** recalls memorable associations he has had with Ed, who was a member of their church in Nisswa. Other Club members will miss his active participation at our hamfests—for example, guarding the rear doors. **Fritz WØKO** said that he had many friendly political discussions with him over the years. Also **Bob KØUSJ** added that Ed was a regular on the Upper Midwest Snowbirds Net. Clearly, Ed will be missed by many. He was 80, held the Advanced Class license, and was a life

Special FEMA, NOAA—EAS Test: The FCC, in coordination with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, will conduct the first nationwide test of the Emergency Alert System (EAS) at 2 PM EST (1900 UTC) **Wednesday, November 9**. According to FEMA, EAS participants -- broadcasters, satellite and digital radio and television providers, and cable and wireline video providers -- "provide a critical public service to the nation as the resilient backbone of alert and warning when all other means of communication are unavailable." —*ARRL Letter*—10-27-11

Recent Gull Lake Repeater Work. In October **Roger WØWUG** and **AI WØRC** reinstalled the controller and currently have it operating from that site. The previous "225" is shut down during this phase. Thus, people should talk it up on the GL machine and make comments about voice levels, beep, ID levels, etc. We are already hearing good reports

Also we are operating with the antenna re-oriented on the tower; hopefully it will give better coverage from that location. In fact, the antenna is much higher than the one at the previous site—actually 400 feet higher. There have been some good coverage reports. Still, there may be some pluses and minuses. A couple of great features you will notice right away are the voice ID, voice time, and courtesy beep. The work is ongoing, so expect the improvements gradually—and be patient. Some modifications must be done on site; others can be done remotely. Also, it has an anti-kerchunk feature, which means that if the repeater has not been in use for some minutes, you have to initially key it a few seconds longer. Thanks, Roger and Al for the info.

Of course, **BIG THANKS** to both Al and Roger for doing this needed work. The BAARC is certainly fortunate to have these capable electronic communications experts in the Club.

Although not shown in this picture with the controlling computer, Al (shown on the left) operated the computer that accesses the controller on-site. He can also control it from home. Right now, there is no autopatch available. In addition, other improvements can be made as we go along. Roger (on the right) is shown with the duplexer for the repeater and his RF communications service monitor close by. Great work from these two very active retirees!! Thanks much!!!
