

Secretary's Report: January Meeting Minutes were published in the February 2014 BAARCer; no corrections were noted. The website was updated for the BAARC 2014 Hamfest. Club roster updated to 42 paid 2014 members. Activities included updating Club letterheads and Hamfest posters and flyers. **Motion to accept**: Al WØRC, **Second** John WØWY, **Passed.**

Treasurer's Report: Report submitted showing all month's account transactions and balances to date. Club insurance agent Jake Brandt's associate, Dan McElroy, returned to the February Board meeting with further information on several issues regarding Club liability coverage. Follow-up questions were raised that will be answered at a future Board meeting.

Motion to accept: John WØWY, Second Al WØRC, Passed.

Membership Meeting Program: Meeting date changes: February meeting program "FMS High Altitude Balloon Club" will be rescheduled to accommodate a later launch date. May Spring Dinner Program: "Amsterdam Island DXpedition" by Ralph Fedor KØIR moved to May 22. June meeting moved to 19th: "Field Day Prep." April 24th meeting program: "Recent Trips to Japan" by Steve Mott NØCRM. March 27th SKYWARN meeting, Doug AAØAW possible speaker.

Upcoming Events: The SKYWARN informational meeting will be held 10AM, March 8th, at Midway Town Hall, Duluth. The Brainerd Hamfest will be held on April 19th, with VE Testing available for all license classes. The HAM Classes have been cancelled due to a low student turnout. A review day is planned for any members planning to test at the Hamfest. Help is always needed for 1PM Friday setup and Saturday teardown. The Brainerd Jaycees "Run For The Lakes" Marathon on Saturday April 26th is the next Club event in Nisswa.

Digital & Emergency Communications: The Club Repeater Committee and Communications Trailer Committee will begin meeting soon. John WØWY reported that the recently surplused Crow Wing County VHF repeater equipment would be listed and sold by auction. John will pursue details on this auction as an opportunity to replace some of our older repeater gear with much newer high-end equipment. John also discussed the possibility of reformatting our traditional Club HF station (formerly at BHS South-Campus) into a remote-operated Club HF station located at the Brainerd high-rise. The board agreed that this would be an excellent opportunity for the Club with great flexibility in actual operating locations and schedules. John will pursue this with the appropriate agencies.

Old / New Business: AI WØRC has received the go-ahead from SMSgt Sprick regarding ANG/AFR removal of the Club tower and antennas at the former BHS-South Campus Club and a second tower at another site in Baxter. The spring tower removal project is planned on one of four possible dates in March and April. Shirley KØDCW reported that along with their appreciation for our event comms service, the CWC Sheriffs department would add a provision for our 2m antennas to their Communications Trailer used during the recent Jaycee Ice-Fishing Extravaganza.

The board meeting was adjourned at 5:25 PM.

DX and the Paper Chase

The past 30 days or so have been filled with good DX especially the DXpedition to Amsterdam Island (FT5ZM), which is on the most wanted list at number 7. What a gift to the worldwide DX community! I jumped into the frenzy eagerly and often. Patience and operating skills brought success to over 165,000 Hams worldwide who joined in on the huge and sometimes boisterous pileups. The group of well-known DXers including Ralph (KØIR) from St. Cloud managed the pileups with great skill. Yours truly worked them on 2 bands on phone and one band on CW and ... what a thrill it was to bust the CW pileup. This DX pedition was very expensive with a cost of \$450,000 bucks. Each participant paid \$10,000 bucks to help provide the DX community with another rare one. The Northern California DX Foundation donated \$50,000 as the largest contributor. A couple of days after FT5ZM went QRT, I worked Vanuatu (YJØOU) on CW for another new one. I'm closing in on 300 confirmed with only 3 to go. Heads up are in order for another DXCC entity (VK9X) to be QRV next month from Christmas Island. The Island is northwest of Australia. What a wonderful hobby especially during this brutally cold winter. That's about it for this past month, so long from Huntersville for now, but remember to sit down at your station and call CQ because someone somewhere is listening for your call. So don't disappoint him or her. You might want to try CW! So long for now, 73 es gud DX from Bob/ WØ7PF

SKYWARN READINESS FOR 2014

As the SKYWARN Season is fast approaching, John WØWY reminds us that we need to be vigilant and report any threatening WX conditions to the NWS in Duluth. Representatives/volunteers from the BAARC will be attending an annual training/refresher session in Duluth on Saturday, March 8th. The meeting focusing on communications will be held at the Midway Town Hall from 10-12:30 or so. Our team will bring back info to share with the rest of us. Usually there will be a local SKYWARN refresher session held in Crow Wing County in April (details available later). For us one main guestion that needs to be solved is how do we in the greater Brainerd area (Crow Wing, Cass, and Aitkin Counties) contact the NWS by radio, rather than the 800 number. As you know, the vhf/uhf links have not worked well in the past—lots of intermittency. Hopefully by "bad WX season," we will have an improved system/plan in place and some answers to those and other concerns. Remember, this a volunteer activity on the part of the hams of the BAARC—anything you can do to assist will be of additional value. Contact John WØWY for more info.


