

Stan Clark, K3JKW, Presented Informative Program on Ham Plates



The former college professor and administrator gave us an interesting view of the history of ham plates. MI was the first to issue them in 1939. In MN it was in 1952. Stan has been collecting them for years as he has moved from east to west, finally settling in Emily with wife Sue. Some plates issued actually have errors in the manufacturing. Because of the unusual one-of-a-kind ham plates, they become valuable to collectors—not just hams. So do not discard your old ones so readily. Examples shown by Stan are these below and on p. 4.

Secretary's Report: January Meeting Minutes were published in the February 2015 <u>BAARCer</u>; correction noted that Treasurer was present for January Board Meeting. The website and Google Calendar were updated for February. Membership roster shows 62 members, with additional renewals forwarded by the Treasurer. A thank-you letter was sent on behalf of the Club to Sarah Dye, KG7JIE, for her donation of many radio items from the estate of her late father and former Club Member, James Brown, W9VEQ.

Motion to accept: Lyle KØLFV, Second Al WØRC, Passed.

**Treasurer's Report**: Treasurer's report submitted showing all month's account transactions and balances to date. The Club has received several Membership renewals and a new Lifetime Membership. **Motion to accept**: Al WØRC, **Second** John WØWY, **Passed**.

Membership Meeting Program: Steve NØCRM reviewed recent and future Club programs and events. Future Club programs to be confirmed are: **March 26**, Steve WØTNT: Cuyuna Country State Recreational Area and **May's Spring Banquet**, Ralph Fedor, KØIR.

Upcoming Events: The next Club events will be the Brainerd Hamfest on Saturday April 18th and the 8th Annual Run For The Lakes Marathon on Saturday April 25th.

Digital & Emergency Communications: The Annual NOAA SKYWARN Ham Radio Coordination Meeting will be held on Saturday March 14th at Salem Lutheran Church in Hermantown, MN. Interested members can contact John WØWY for more information if interested in attending. The SKYWARN Spotter Training meetings follow in April with the Brainerd session scheduled at 6:30 PM at the Land Services Building behind the Historic Courthouse. John was recently made aware of available grants to support Club expenses related to the SKYWARN program. The Club will consider applying for this next year.

Al WØRC reported on 2 new options for SKYWARN reporting to the Duluth NOAA weather office. WX event activation of the Echo Link system at Duluth is one possibility, while internet linking of our new Digital Repeaters with theirs is another consideration. More information will be available once the new Digital Interface boxes arrive and are configured.

New Business: The 145.130 repeater was moved to the High Rise site and is functioning with Echo Link and using one of the new digital units. Plans are to next swap the 147.225 and 146.700 repeaters between the Crosby and Crow Wing Power sites. Remaining equipment will be removed from the old South Brainerd tower site in March. Purchase and possible standardization of 2 new VHF repeater antennas was discussed. Al and John will do more research into the merits between the traditional metal "trombone-style" DB224 and newer, lighter fiberglass antenna designs.

The **BAARC Technology Group** held its second meeting following the Club Breakfast Meeting on Saturday February 21 at 10:30 AM at the Brainerd Public Library, Lyle KØLFV, Chairman, with many attendees. Work continued on the planning for a Club Remote Base Station. The next meeting is scheduled for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday of the month, March 21, 2015 at 10:30 AM in the Brainerd Library large meeting room.

The board meeting was adjourned at 5:10 PM.

#### German Radio Amateurs Breathe New Life into "Orphaned" Shortwave Channel —info ARRL

A few radio amateurs are frustrated broadcasters, and when German national broadcaster the Deutsche Welle closed down a 500 kW shortwave broadcast transmitter near Munich, an entity headed and





operated by hams applied for and was granted the vacant channel of 6070 kHz in the 49 meter shortwave band. DARC Radio -- which has a business association with the Deutscher Amateur Radio Club (DARC) but is privately owned -- now has a 10 kW broadcast station, branded "Channel 292," up and running, and a new Amateur Radio DX program will debut next month. "After the demolition of one of the world's biggest shortwave facilities of the Deutsche Welle last year, we managed to get an official radio broadcast license for the German Amateur Radio Club and have built up a shortwave transmitter with some parts of the old 500 kW transmitter from there," said DARC Radio Project Manager Rainer Englert, DF2NU, an ARRL member and president of the Munich South Section of the DARC. "As far as we know, there is no similar ham project like this worldwide." The Deutsche Welle used the 6070 kHz channel until mid-2013 for European transmissions. DARC Radio hopes to fund its operating expenses by leasing airtime. The DARC is a customer, and under its banner, a weekly Amateur Radio-oriented magazine of DARC news, contest schedules, DX information, interviews, DXpedition reports, market reviews, technical hints, and "some nice old music from the '70s and '80s" will debut on Sunday, March 22, at 1000 UTC, Englert told ARRL. The program will be in German, but the RSGB has expressed interest in contributing English-language program segments, he said. The inaugural DX magazine will be repeated on Monday, March 23, at 1600 UTC.

According to the DARC, the initial March 22 broadcast will air from a 100 kW transmitter in Austria, while the repeat broadcast on March 23 will emanate from Radio DARC's 10 kW transmitter near Ingolstadt, Germany.

#### Amateur Radio Saved My Life —from the ARRL

September 30, 2013 started out as a beautiful day in the east-central lowa town of Clinton, on the Mississippi river. I had just left my job at the end of the day and wanted to enjoy the fabulous weather. I decided to throw my leg over my motorcycle and see what the Fall countryside looked like.

After an hour of riding, the wind whipped up to the point where I decided to head home. My route took me by a construction site on the edge of town. This is where everything went wrong. I must have been gawking at the construction site and not paying attention to the road. A big gust of wind hit me and I landed in a 10 foot deep ditch.

I was unconscious and when I awoke in the ditch, by estimate an hour later, I had to figure out where I was. The motorcycle was on top of me pressing me into the dirt wall of the ditch. I looked up and could see the edge of the road, six feet above my head. I removed my helmet and considered my options deep in the ditch and unable to move my lower body.

I heard cars approach and stuck up my hand and waved -- nobody stopped. They could not see me in the ditch. I thought about trying to throw my helmet onto the road to attract attention but could not get my arms to work well. That is one of the last things I remembered for six days.

The balance of my ordeal was conveyed to me long after the accident by friends and two daughters. I had been riding the motorcycle with an H-T hooked into my pants pocket with a speaker mic attached to my collar. I was informed later that I had put out an emergency call on the 145.430 MHz machine in Clinton.

Two ham-friends heard the distress call and responded. One called 911, and the other drove to the area I described on the radio. He drove by my location twice and even the police could not find me from their cars. The other operator stayed on the phone with the dispatcher and tried to get me to give a better description of my location. My speech was slurred when I responded and then I apparently lost consciousness. The 911 dispatcher wanted me to call on my cell phone and give them a better description of my location - I never heard the request.

The officer that found me in the ditch said he and his partner had exited the squad car and walked along the side of the road until they spotted me at the bottom of the ditch, which had washed away at the bottom, wedging the bike and me into the wash out. Having lost consciousness, I never saw nor heard anyone until one of the emergency personnel woke me, stating they were going to get me out and to the hospital.

The next day October 1, 2013, I was transported by ambulance to the hospital in lowa City. CT scans revealed a broken back pinching the spinal column, five cracked vertebra, a fractured pelvis, broken elbow and a bleeding brain injury. A year of surgeries, infections, pneumonia and physical therapy followed. I am grateful to be able to tell my story.
