It's so rewarding to check the mailbox and find a QSL card from a rare DX you've worked. Now it's easier than ever to send for your cards by using the OQRS system and Club Log— and it's less expensive. Getting the DXpedition on Tromelin Island was a thrill... you don't hear Tromelin on the air often. Getting the QSL card via OQRS usually takes 4-5 weeks. When 6 months had gone by without the card, I was getting concerned. I emailed the DXpedition pilot and was informed that the cards were finished and on the way back to the Island to receive the postage and ... a special cancelation celebrating Amateur Radio. When the card arrived, it had a 3"x4" stamp plate with 3 stamps included... beautiful, colorful, special, and unique to the event. What a thrill to receive something that special commemorating the event and its success! DXing is special and this response from the DXpedition will remain in my memory bank forever. The past 30 days produced some good DX and some poor band conditions, but not at the same time. CLC Wilderness Search and Rescue

On April 11, 2015, Central Lakes College held a Wilderness Search and Rescue Class/Exercise at the CLC location. The morning consisted of classes on the Incident Command System, Search and Rescue, and Wilderness Medicine. The afternoon was Search and Rescue events with actual victims. There were three search and rescue teams made up of EMTs and First Responders along with a radio operator. There were two search and rescue events, each involved finding and rescuing the victim. The ARMOR radio system was used on the first search and rescue event, and Amateur Radio was used on the second. We



had four amateur radio operators from the BAARC: John WØWY, Geoffrey KDØPDB, Michael KEØAFZ, and Al WØRC. John was stationed in the Command Center, Michael with Team 1, Geoffrey with Team 2, and Al with Team 3.
