Secretary's Report: Membership reminders for 2015 dues were sent out with several paid dues received.

Membership roster shows 70 paid members. CJ WØWUH became our newest Lifetime Member. The Club website was updated for the October meeting presentation and BAARCer. The Club welcomes new member Robert K6RCO, making his new home here from CA.

Motion to accept: Al WØRC, Second John WØWY, Passed.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer's report was delayed until membership meeting in Doug's absence. Noted with great appreciation was Lyle KØLFV's constant efforts in equipment sales for the Club, as well as finding bargains for new Club gear.

Membership Meeting Program: Steve NØCRM reviewed recent and future Club programs and events. Future Club programs possibilities include: Station Grounding by Crow Wing Power's Pat Goff, ARRL Division Update, and The ARRL. The Holiday meeting dates will be November 19 and December 17.

Upcoming Events: Dates were announced for the **Brainerd Jaycees Ice Fishing Extravaganza**: January 23, 2016, **Mid-MN 150 Sled Dog Race**: February 13th, 2016, and **Brainerd Jaycees Run for the Lakes Marathon**: April 30, 2016. Ron KØGOP reported on a possible Club Activity to add to the Club calendar for June. More information will be gathered for the **Sour Grapes Half & Half Trail Run**: June 11, 2016 and considered by the Board and Membership. **Digital & Emergency Communications:** John WØWY and Al WØRC had a meeting with the new Brainerd Fire Chief, Timothy Holmes, by way of continuing the good relationship between the Club and the department. John will assume coordination of the Club meeting calendar and the Training Room schedule. The new 146.700 MHz repeater in North Brainerd is online; signal reports are sought at different locations and power levels. John reported that he and Lyle are almost finished with some shelving in the Club area of the new EOC and hope to finish coax and antenna work before winter.

Proposed: purchase by Ron KØGOP of 150' of rotor cable for the EOC installation.

Motion to accept: AI WØRC, Second Steve NØCRM, Passed.

New Business: The Crow Wing County Sherriff's Office has transferred 4 VHF radios to the Club including 1 portable repeater and 3 base (desktop) units. **Proposed**: John WØWY will bring to Granite City Electronics to reprogram for amateur frequency use (\$75 each; \$300 total). **Motion to accept**: John WØWY, **Second** Al WØRC, **Passed**. Steve NØCRM has discovered that in addition to our brainerdham.org domain, the Club has also maintained a wouj.org domain. As both are soon coming up for renewal it was decided to drop the unused wouj.org domain and save the \$75 per year fee. The new domain renewal for brainerdham.org will now be linked to the Club account and Gmail address. Michael KEØAFZ will assist Mitch ADØHJ in purchasing and setting up a VPN for Club repeater control. Proposed: Purchase of another CAT200 interface and CL100 Controller for the Crosby site, not to exceed \$800.

Motion to accept: Al WØRC, Second John WØWY, Passed.

The 50% discounted price of \$500 for the new Yaesu Fusion Repeaters was extended to all registered Club frequency pairs. **Proposed**: Purchase up to 3 more repeaters at the discount price for backup and future site use; not to exceed \$1500.

Motion to accept: AI WØRC, Second Mitch ADØHJ, Passed.

The board meeting was adjourned at 5:10 PM.

ARLB030: ARRL Asks FCC to Clarify that Hams May Modify Non-Amateur Gear for Amateur Use

The ARRL has asked the FCC to make clear that Amateur Radio licensees may modify non-amateur equipment for use on Amateur Radio frequencies. Some hams have expressed concerns that recently proposed rules would inhibit post-sale modification of Wi-Fi equipment, now sometimes altered for use on Amateur Radio frequencies. The ARRL made its point in comments filed on October 8 on a Notice of Proposed Rule Making (NPRM) in ET Docket 15-170 and RM-11673. The proceeding mostly addresses proposed amendments to FCC rules regarding authorization of RF equipment. Predicted solar flux is 110 on October 30, 105 on October 31 and November 1, 100 on November 2, 95 on November 3-4, 90 on November 5, 85 on November 6-8, 90 on November 9, 95 on November 10-11, then 100, 105 and 110 on November 12-14, 115 on November 15-16, then 120, 115 and 110 on November 17-19, and 105 on November 20-24. Flux values then drop to 85 on November 30 through December 5, and next rise above 100 a few days later.
