

The May Board Meeting Minutes, as published in the BAARCer, were accepted as written following a motion by John W3MQD, and seconded by Terry KIØFW. Our Treasurer, John W3MQD, gave the financial report, which was accepted unanimously following a motion by Steve KCØYTE and a second by Al WØRC.

Upcoming BAARC events include: ARRL Field Day, June 28 & 29, and will be held at Cuyuna Overlook. Our Brainerd Hamfest is July 12, 2008. Workers are needed for the Hamfest. 
### **June BAARC Membership Meeting Minutes**

**RDN (Regional Distribution Node) Exercise conducted June 24, 2008.** The Central Region Department of Public Health and the Central RFegeion Hospital Group took part in this emergency exercise in which 14 counties participated. The exercise had two control points, the MACC, at the Red Cross Center in St. Cloud and the RDN Center at the Crow Wing County Highway Garage at the Brainerd Airport. the scenario of the exercise was that if there were an emergency in Central Minnesota that required medical supplies sent to the central regional hospitals, this could be done with a coordinated and organized effort. This effort would be coordinated and managed by the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH). Jan Jonessen coordinated the efforts at the MACC and notified all the counties that they had to send a truck to the RDN (Remote Distribution Point) at the county garage and pick up medical supplies to be distributed to the hospitals. John Bowen, KDØCIZ, Crow Wing Co. Emergency Manager and Michelle Jordan from the Crow Wing County Public Health Department coordinated the efforts at the RDN. Of course, this is all part the national emergency management system and Ham Radio played a big part in providing emergency communications between the MACC and RDN. John WØWY was at the EOC office in Brainerd, and Al WØRC was at the RDN. Roger WØWUG also participated. A packet-radio connection was made between the RDN and the EOC, and voice communications was the link between the EOC/RDN and the MACC using the St. Cloud repeater, where Jack WØMBD was the NCS at the MACC. All in all, the exercise ran smoothly providing participants and groups with ideas on noted improvements and future plans for effectiveness. ### *13 Club Members Help Make 2008 Bike Tour A Success*

The year 2008 marked the 19<sup>th</sup> annual Tour of the Lakes bike ride which was held Saturday, June 7<sup>th</sup>. Over 1,200 riders of all ages participated under partly cloudy skies and in temperatures ranging from a 6 AM start of 53-degrees to an afternoon finish of around 72-degrees.

"The weather was really the only unknown," said Sharon Bodie, the event director from the sponsoring Paul Bunyan Cyclists club of Brainerd/Baxter, "and we were so thankful that the rain we had during the week held off on Saturday."

Besides the nice weather, the tour organization was very commendable according to comments heard by many of our club members and from many participants who came from as far away as Iowa and Thunder Bay. A very large group comes every year from the Twin City Bicycle Club. They were evident this year with their bright gold and black riding outfits.

BAARC members were evident too in our bright green safety vests assisting in many ways with the organization and administration of the event. Specifically: Terry KIØFW, shadowed the tour director handling administrative details; Rest Stop information of all types were handled by amateurs, Curt NØCRM; John W3MQD; Charles W5CCL; and Alan AAØAS; the bike maintenance vehicles ( support and gear, SAG wagons) were manned by John WØWY, Shirley KØDCW, and Darrell ABØVP; rover units were, Roger WØWUG, and on their bicycles, Kathy KØTHY and Lyle KØLR; with net control duties from the club's EMCOM trailer done extremely well (again) by Al, WØRC; and, our most senior member, 87-year-old, George Swanson, KCØBH. A BIG thanks to all of you for an outstanding job and sticking-it-out for a long day.

Both Al and George commented on the Club's use of a growing number of APRS units again this year. "It really makes the dispatching of SAG units much more timely and efficient to know where you guys are at all times," said Al. "It saves time (and fuel) to send the closest unit," he said. George said he really likes the new large-screen computer monitor so that the "whole 35 and 70 mile courses" can be seen with all units displayed along with various significant waypoints on the detailed base map of the area the tour covered. (Thanks to Al for creating the map, too.) Hams running APRS were: AAØAS, W5CCL, KØDCW, WØWUG, and WØWY—in vehicle/mobiles, and KØTHY and KØLR on bicycle mobiles. Next year we hope to add a few more.

The best news to report is that there were no known public safety activities/incidents/accidents or medical emergencies that involved any of the event participants. The worst news to report is that there were **no** root beer floats at the end of the ride. And did we hear those complaints! 73's John WØMY



Another important resource is a good computer logging system. My logging program is Contact Log 2.5 by N3FJP. Computer logging makes it fun to keep a good record of your contacts. In my next column I'll be discussing how to get that elusive QSL card.
