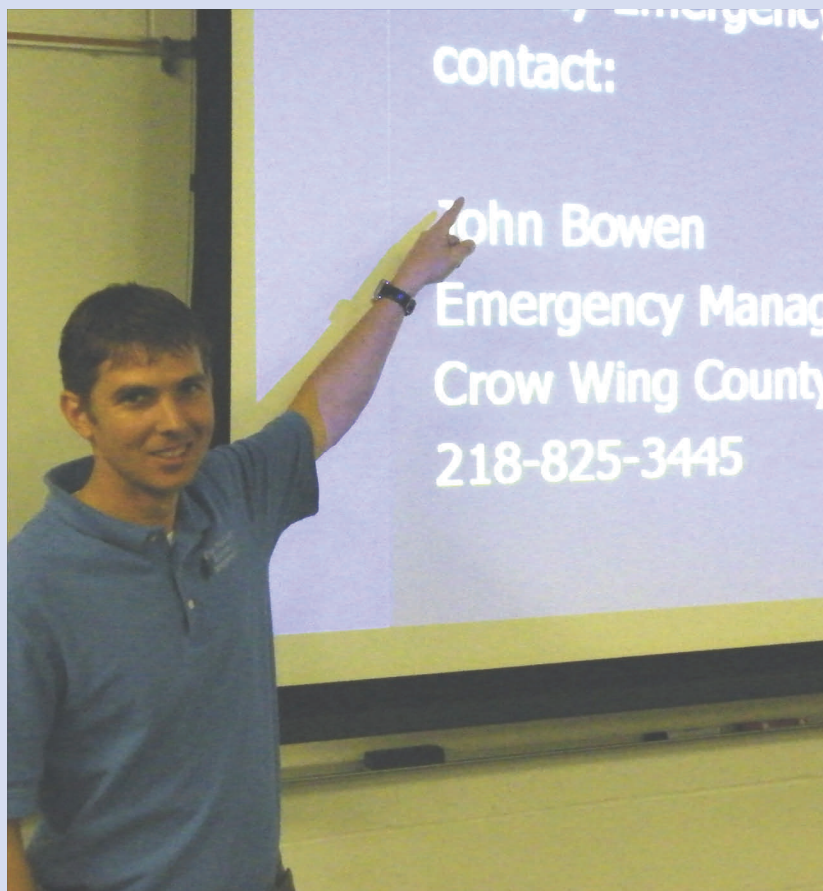

Al WØRC reported on the month's activities in Digital & Emergency Communications. Al WØRC, Lyle KØLFV, and Roger WØWUG discussed a work session at Ski Gull next Monday. DX and the PAPER CHASE

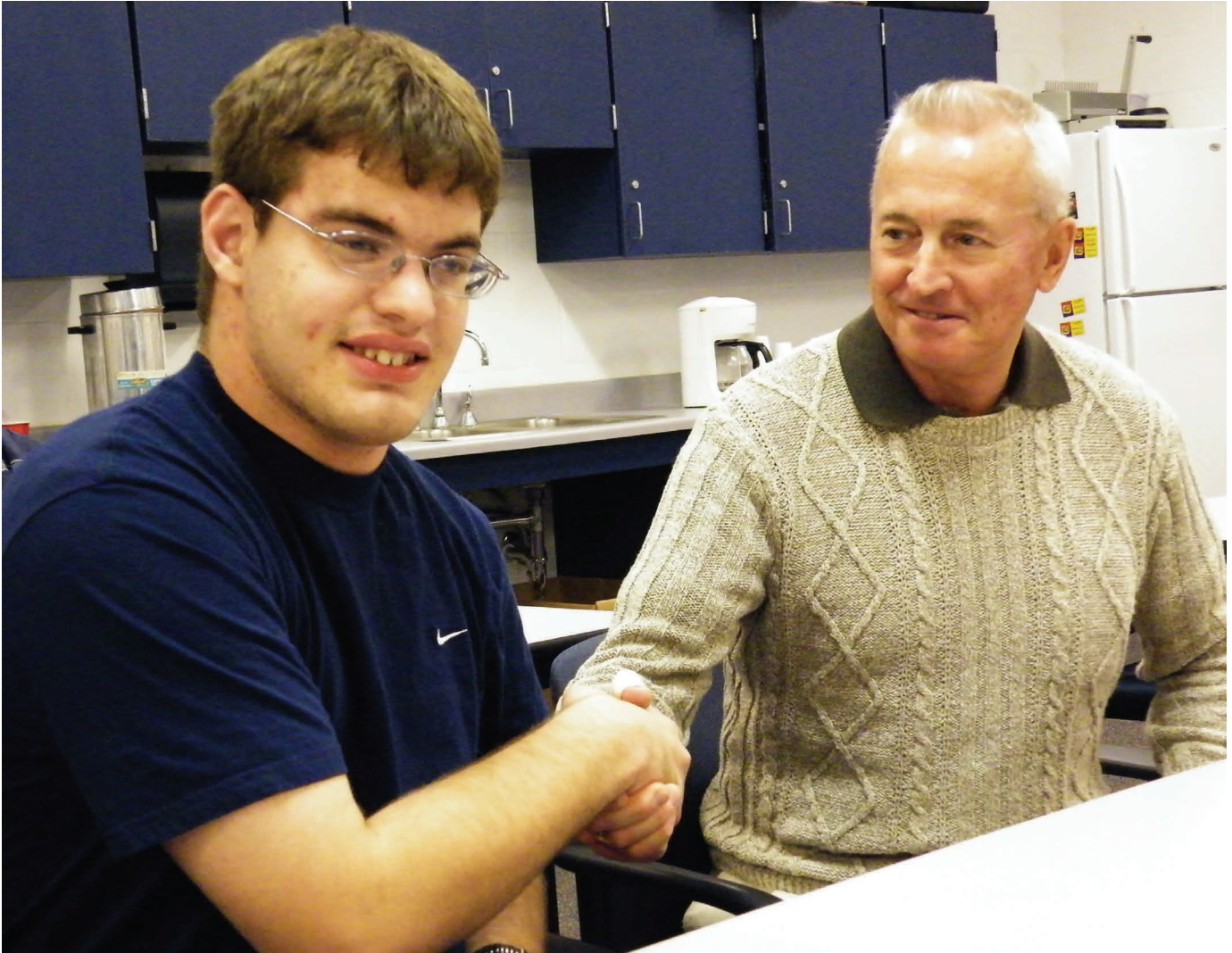

SOLAR UPDATE

Tad "The sway of magic potent over Sun and star" Cook, K7RA, last week reported: Sunspot 1007 is still there, but probably rotating off the visible solar disk sometime today. This is the eighth sunspot of the new solar cycle -- and also the largest. Sunspot numbers for October 30-November 5 were 13, 16, 16, 17, 18, 14 and 11 with a mean of 15. The 10.7 cm flux was 66.8, 68.1, 66.7, 69.1, 69.5, 68 and 67.7 with a mean of 68. The estimated planetary A indices were 11, 6, 1, 2, 1, 1 and 0 with a mean of 3.1. The estimated mid-latitude A indices were 11, 5, 0, 2, 1, 1 and 0 with a mean of 2.9.
