December 18, 2008— 4:00 PM— BAARC Board Minutes – Small Mtg. Room—Brainerd Public Library

The meeting was opened by President Lyle KØLFV while in attendance were Treasurer John W3MQD, Coordinator of Public, Digital and Emergency Services Al WØRC, Advisor Shirley KØDCW, Special Projects Director Terry KIØFW, and Secretary Darrell ABØVP.



The Report of the November Meeting as published in the BAARCCer was accepted as written. Treasurer John W3MQD led a discussion of the Financial Report dated 11/30/2008. Al WØRC moved to approve the Financial Reports; the motion was unanimously approved following a second by Terry KIØFW.

Al WØRC reported on the month's activities in Digital & Emergency Communications. There was a discussion of the importance of the APRS coverage provided by the Sebeka Water Tower site and the damage done by high winds that broke the antenna. The Wadena Radio Club doesn't have the \$200 that is needed to replace the antenna; it was decided to bring the matter to the membership to discuss and vote on BAARC's providing the funding.

A Draft of the Brainerd Public School Memorandum of Understanding was reviewed. Only the Forestview School will be available for BAARC membership meetings as there is no solution to the South Campus staffing-cost problem. We will maintain and have access to the Club Station at South Campus. The meeting was adjourned about 5:00 PM.

December 18, 2008— 7:00 PM—BAARC Membership Minutes – Large Meeting Room – Brainerd Public Library

President Lyle KØLFV opened the meeting with about twenty Hams and two guests in attendance.

The November Membership Meeting Minutes as published in the BAARCCer were accepted as written after a motion by Jim WØYA and a second by Mike WAØLVC. Treasurer John W3MQD presented a Year-to-Date Financial Report dated November 30, 2008. John WØWY moved to approve the financial reports that were unanimously approved following a second by Jim WØYA.

The business meeting was adjourned about 7:35 PM. The next Membership Meeting will be on January 29th, 7:00 PM at the Brainerd Fire Station.

The Brainerd Fire Station will be available for BAARC monthly membership meetings through May 2009. The Annual Gala Christmas Party with lavish snacks, refreshments and lively conversation followed.

DX and the Paper Chase

As this newsletter goes to press, the holidays have passed. Nevertheless, I want to wish all of you and your families Merry Christmas and a very Healthy and Happy New Year. Keeping the meaning of Peace on Earth in our hearts and the meaning of Christmas in our daily lives will brighten our futures in these troubled times. The month of December was not too kind to the world of DX with the sunspots gone and the sun uncooperative... nonetheless, there was DX out there to those of us who got on HF and called CQ. The signals left a lot to be desired, and the DX window to Europe pretty much closed during the last 3 weeks of December. This station worked ZK's and ZL's on 40-meters in the wee hours of the mornings and with sporadic openings, some European stations on 17-meters. During the 10-meter contesting weekend the region also was under blizzard conditions. Normally this doesn't cause any concern, but this time, my beams loaded up with a good coating of hoar frost making it all but impossible to transmit a signal. The 10-meter band was full of contestants and even though I was unable to make any contacts, I heard their signals. Yesterday (Dec 17TH) I worked a station in Morocco on 17-meters...I heard him calling CQ and I was lucky enough to get his attention. Since there was no pileup, we were able to have a very nice QSO exchanging operating conditions and WX reports. I keep a conversion table at my operating position that converts Fahrenheit to Celsius and this makes the other operators feel more comfortable when you give the report in Celsius. When we signed, there was a huge pileup behind me waiting for Morocco (CN) and I found myself grinning that I had the first leisurely QSO, and the rest of the stations would have to be satisfied with a 59 and GUD DX. As we head into 2009, we're all eagerly waiting for some cycle-24 sunspots to liven up the world of DX. In the meantime, don't forget to turn your HF radios on, key up and call CQ because there is a whole world of operators out there waiting to QSO with you—**So long from Huntersville, 73 for now, and good DX from Bob/WØZPE.**



Gleaned from the ARRL Propagation Report on Sunspot Cycle —Jan. 2, 2009.

2008 was a year of very low solar activity. Over forty percent of this year's propagation bulletins reported zero sunspots for their respective weeks. The average daily sunspot number for the year was 4.7, and in 2007 it was 12.8.

The yearly averages of daily sunspot numbers for 1999-2008 were 136.3, 173, 170.3, 176.6, 109.2, 68.6, 48.9, 26.1, 12.8 and 4.7.

Two years ago we wrote, "This is the first bulletin of 2007, the year we'll likely see the end of sunspot cycle 23, the beginning of cycle 24, and the minima between cycles". One year ago in the first bulletin of 2008 we noted the same quote from the previous year, and wrote "Now a year later we might say the same about 2008".

This is probably still true for past year, because since early 2008 we saw cycle 24 spots, and what looks like a slow increase in activity toward the end of the year, although a week of sunspots at the end of December would have helped to sustain the upturn.

We've been looking at a three-month moving average of sunspot numbers, and the average for October-December, centered on November, was 4.4, about the same as the number 4.5 centered on October.

WØUJ Autopatch Instruction—An Open Autopatch (for use by members and non-members):

- * Brings up the Autopatch (gets dial tone)
- # Brings down the Autopatch (hangs up the phone)
- *** Time-out Override (use after phone contact is made)

Without Override, the phone will hang up automatically after about 3 minutes.

Reverse Autopatch Number: The number is available, but it must be used securely. Ask an officer in private about its use and functions.

Speed-Dial Numbers

- 2 for County Law Enforcement Center in Brainerd
- 3 for MN Highway Patrol
for MN Road Information (non emergency)

Note: Occasionally, a ring will be heard over the repeater from a caller. Then answer the call in the usual manner and just say: "Hello." Don't reveal that this is a repeater/autopatch to some unknown person on the line at that time. Many wrong-number calls come in this way. Just punch the patch down. As always ID after you have done this.
