BAARC Website Update

On Tuesday, February 2, 2010, the BAARC website www.brainerdham.org went silent. This occurred just after some basic updates were made and just prior to the February BAARCer was to be updated. A call to a Crosslake Communication customer service representative indicated that "everything is just fine" and that sometimes the routings "get lost" and can possibly take up to 72 hours to "push out to the world again." Well, the wait was not an easy one, and upon finding that the site was still not on line, another call to the same customer service representative was again that everything looked fine, although he was helpful in pointing in the correct direction to help diagnose the problem.

Upon further investigation it was discovered the our DNS registration had expired. So a quick email to the previous Webmaster (Mark Person) revealed that yes it did expire, and that he would be the only one that could renew the account. Mark WØMH was gracious to help work through the renewal process and subsequently the hand off of the account. Within less than an hour the website was back up and running, although it still could have taken up to 72 hours from that point as well.

The website has also been updated with a newer calendar. This calendar provides extra details that would have been much too time consuming to update with the old method. The new calendar format and administration can also be updated from any computer (with the correct login information) and can even be updated or items added via a mobile smart phone. Such as in a board meeting, the calendar can be brought up, viewed, the item added, and instantly available on the website.

When viewing details of the calendar, you can pull up linked maps. You can even add the item to your own personal calendar on your PC.

Thursday, February 25, 2010 - 6:00 PM - BAARC Board Meeting Minutes Brainerd Fire Station

President Charles W5CCL opened the meeting with Vice President Steve Mott, KCØYTE, Treasurer Doug KDØERE, Past President Lyle KØLFV, Past President Al WØRC, Trustee & "BAARCCer" Editor Fritz WØKO, and Secretary Ron KØGOP, in attendance. A motion to accept the published minutes for December and January as approved, was made by Steve KCØYTE, seconded by Lyle KØLFV, and passed. The Treasurer's Report was then presented by Doug KDØERE and approved following a motion by John WØWY and second by Al WØRC. The Treasurer reported a total accounts balance (info available from him) and a current membership of 49. Also discussed was the need for a Club debit card account to make automatic payments for important recurring fees like the BAARC website domain name registration. Approval for a \$100 limit card was passed following a motion by Al WØRC, and a second by Lyle KØLFV.

Upcoming Events: A chairman for the **Brainerd Jaycee's "Run for the Lakes Marathon"** will be sought at the 7 PM Membership Meeting. It will be held on Saturday, April 24th. John WØWY has secured Alan Cibuzar of A.W. Research Laboratories, as guest speaker for the **BAARC Spring Dinner** on Thursday, May 27th. Social time will begin at 5:30PM, with dinner and a program following. Lyle KØLFV will send an e-mail reminder six weeks prior to the event. Lyle also announced surrounding club **HamFest in Buffalo, MN - March 27th, Fargo, ND - April 17th, and Duluth/Superior - May 1st.**

Old Business: Al WØRC reported on the first session of the **Ham Radio License Classes** held on Tuesday, February 23rd. Fourteen students are enrolled with ages ranging from 10 to 65 years. Classes are led by Al and John WØWY for the Technician and General levels, and meet weekly, ending with VE testing on Tuesday, April 13th. VE testing can also be scheduled for Extra class on that evening. **The MN Repeater Council Annual Meeting** will be held at the Brainerd Fire Station on April 17th. Al read a thank-you card received from Dan Levno, chairman of the recent **Mid MN 150 Sled Dog Race** event. A Club thank-you card was sent to Roger WRØG for the use of his repeater during that Saturday. Charles W5CCL reported that he has contacted **Nate Phillips, Boy Scouts of America-Pine Tree District** and having been invited to speak about Amateur Radio and the BAARC at their March 9th meeting. Charles is exploring ways that the Club can encourage the next generation of Hams and Club members through "Radio merit badge" help and participating with them in the international event, **Jamboree On The Air (JOTA)**. This annual ARRL-supported event is held on the third weekend of October.

New Business: Steve KCØYTE will change Club website domain name registration, from individual to Club ownership. The aforementioned Club debit card will then automatically pay the recurring registration fees. This will prevent any future lapse in the renewal process from reoccurring. He also discussed the advantages of the new Google event calendar on the Club homepage. Finally, Ron KØGOP discussed the need for updated "camera-ready" artwork of the BAARC logo. Current Club logo image files are poor in resolution and clarity, and unsuitable for use at more than thumbnail size. The Board selected one of the three new versions of the BAARC logo pending further approval at the 7 PM Membership Meeting. The Board Meeting was adjourned at 7:00 PM following a motion and second by Doug KDØERE, and Steve KCØYTE.

President Charles W5CCL opened the meeting at 7:10 PM with twenty-one Hams and guests in attendance. A motion to accept the published minutes for December and January as approved, was made by John WØWY, seconded by Shirley KØDCW, and passed. The Treasurer's Report was then presented by Doug KDØERE, and approved following a motion by John WØWY and second by Darrell ABØVP.

Upcoming Events: Al WØRC volunteered to again chair the **Brainerd Jaycee's "Run for the Lakes Marathon"** on Saturday, April 24th. John WØWY has secured Alan Cibuzar of A.W. Research Laboratories, as guest speaker for the **BAARC Spring Dinner** on Thursday, May 27th. A request was forwarded from event chairman, Jim Shubert WØJDS, that members are requested to email him with their reservations ASAP.

Digital & Emergency Communications: John WØWY will attend the annual **SKYWARN Planning meeting** at the NWS bureau in Duluth on March 13th. The date for local SKYWARN training, usually held in April, has not yet been determined.

Old Business: Al WØRC reported on the first session of the **Ham Radio License Classes** held on Tuesday, February 23rd. Fourteen students are enrolled with ages ranging from 10 to 65 years. Al read a thank you card received from Dan Levno, chairman of the recent **Mid MN 150 Sled Dog Race** event. A Club thank you card was sent to Roger, WRØG for the use of his repeater during that Saturday. Charles W5CCL has been invited to speak to the **Boy Scouts of America-Pine Tree District** about Amateur Radio and the BAARC at their March 9th meeting. The members discussed ways that the Club can encourage the next generation of Hams and Club members through "Radio merit badge" help and participating with them in the international event, **Jamboree On The Air (JOTA)**. A motion to pursue this Club involvement was made by John W3MQD, seconded by Skee WØDCY, and passed unanimously.

New Business: John WØWY and Lyle KØLFV discussed the need for new Club vests for event use. Several options were explored with the members regarding style, cost and markings. Further information regarding vest sources, customizing, and cost are needed. Steve KCØYTE discussed changing Club website domain name registration, from individual to Club ownership, as well as the new Google event calendar on the Club homepage. DX and the Paper Chase

Cycle 24 is good and counting. There is enough DX out there to occupy plenty of your time on 12, 15, 17 and 20 meters. I have been working DX on both 12 and 15 meters barefoot (100 watts) with very good results. Those of you who are new to HF, there's ample opportunity to start working for DXCC credits. I still feel that the DXCC fraternity is what this hobby represents for both SSB and CW operators. Speaking of CW...I'm in the study mode (again) listening to my code tutor 20 minutes daily. I'm copying at 10 WPM (sort of) and thoroughly enjoying it. There are 3 great DXpeditions on the calendar coming up and all are rare calls. Iraq (YI9PSE) will be QRV from 04/05/10 to 04/13/10; Lord Howe Island (VK9CLH) will be QRV 05/21/10 to 05/31/10; and Palestine (EX4) will be QRV 05/28/10 to 06/06/10. These DXpeditions will give us a rare opportunity to operate scarce countries that would otherwise be all but impossible to add to our DXCC efforts. I received my QSL card from Conway Reef (3D2ØCR) last week, and that made my day! DX is alive and well and with Cycle 24 kicking into gear—even very modest stations can rack up some good contacts worldwide. For those of faith, welcome to the Lenten season. I would also remind all of you to sit down in front of your radios and call CQ because others somewhere are listening—don't disappoint them. So long from Huntersville, 73 and good DX from **Bob/WØZPE**.

The 2010 Mid-Minnesota 150 Dogsled Race

On Saturday, February 13, 2010, 12 operators from the BAARC once again supported the Mid-Minnesota 150 Dog Sled Race from Emily to Remer with Pro-Class and Recreation Class dog sled teams. The Pro Teams traveled Outing to Emily via the Snowmobile trail with a 1-hr mandatory layover. The Recreation Class traveled from Outing to Remer. BAARC operators manned 8 checkpoints along the Pro-Class route and ten checkpoints on the Pro/Rec leg to Remer. The checkpoints included both the start and finish lines as well.

Like the previous year, we used a **spreadsheet tracking system using a laptop to monitor race progress**. This allowed us to track progress and watch for problems. One specific incident this year occurred on the longer Pro Class route. One team (#13 Emilie) did not make it to Checkpoint #2 and was a full hour behind when she did make it to the checkpoint. At that time, Al and others were preparing to dispatch and perform a search. Apparently, she made a wrong turn and did not realize it until she hit another fork in the trail. Thus she had traveled an estimated 12 miles extra. Even with the hour delay at checkpoint #2, she was only 12 minutes behind at the Outing rest stop.

The **tracking system** also allowed us to manage our checkpoints and to allow operators to step away for a period of time and return to the checkpoint when required. Using times from the Recreation Class, we were able to predict when the Pro Class sleds would approximately hit the checkpoints. Race officials, event coordinators, and various teams came in to the ECOMM trailer to assess race progress. This service has been appreciated by all.

Lessons Learned:

- Next year we should plan on attending both of the musher meetings. Dave **KCØTGT** did this on his own accord for this day, and it proved valuable in that we learned of additional racers who were added to the race log for tracking purposes.
- It is highly suggested by Roger (**WØWUG**) and John (**WØWY**) that we provide two people at the Pikus Road/trail intersection due to confusing trails (both snowmobile and ATV).
- Checkpoint #2 on County Road 1 and 3, was a bit confusing, as well—so we logged GPS coordinates for that location. The coordinates are N 46 43.522 W 93 44.309 (off Aitkin Co. Rd 3, 489th Lane).
- In addition, we need to manage a little bit better at the Remer finish line with operators. We had to shift some at the last minute to cover it. We should focus on having the finish line covered.
