The Board Meeting was cancelled for December.

The President opened the meeting at 7:03 PM with 22 members and guests present. The November minutes were approved as printed in the October <u>BAARCer</u>. The Secretary reported a present Club membership of 59 with many 2012 dues already in. The Treasurer's Report was presented by Doug KDØERE, and approved.

Digital & Emergency Communications: Al WØRC reported on the on-air status of the repeater at the Boy Scout Camp on 147.390+.

Upcoming Events: Briefly discussed were dates and available details for the **2012 Jaycee Ice Fishing Extravaganza**, **Mid-MN 150 Dog Sled Race**, and **Brainerd Hamfest**.

Old/New Business: John WØWY discussed plans for the weekly Ham Licensing Classes beginning on Tuesday, February 7 at the Brainerd Fire Station. The Class schedule is: Technician – 6:30 to 7:30, General – 7:30 to 8:30, and Extra – 8:30 to 9:30. General and Extra students are encouraged to also take in the prior session(s) for review. The classes will end prior to the April 14, the Brainerd Hamfest VE testing date. Cost for the class is \$25.00 for each license level, including books and other materials. FCC license testing is separate at \$15.00.

Balloon Project and NASA—Forestview Middle School and BAARC



Jim Reed, on left ,shown with **Steve**, came to our December club meeting. Jim had contacted a couple of Club members regarding help with a school project; he came to explain the project and asked for some technical help.

Jim Reed and Cory Olson, both teachers at Forestview Middle School, are planning a special balloon project. The intent is to launch a helium balloon that contains a payload of a digital camera and a tracking device. The camera will be programmed to take a picture every minute; they will then sync the camera with the tracking device and will know its GPS location and altitude. They can then do some 3Dmodeling in Google Maps when done and are planning on having a couple classes after launch that deal with data analysis. They would like some help tracking the payload once it starts coming back to Earth. It may come down somewhat close to our area, but it could also travel to the western side of Wisconsin. This is where we can help them out. During our December meeting several people met and talked to Jim about the project. The BAARC will also hold an onsite overview of Amateur Radio for this group, so that we can get them acquainted with Amateur Radio and also possibly give them an overview of how we will help them track using APRS. In addition to that project, we talked to Jim about the possibility of entertaining a NASA project.

NASA is now accepting proposals from U.S. schools, museums, science centers and community youth organizations to host an Amateur Radio on the International Space Station, or ARISS, contact between July 15, 2012, and Jan. 15, 2013. To maximize these radio contact opportunities, NASA is looking for organizations that will draw large numbers of participants and integrate the contact into a well developed education plan. Proposals are due Jan. 30, 2012. Jim was very interested in learning more about this, so we will be looking into that as well. —-Steve Mott
